




Theme: Dinosaurs!





















Opening (Closing) Song: Hands Go Up


This week's early literacy practice: READ!

Popsicle Stick Dinosaur (via gluedtomycraftsblog.com)

Grab three popsicle sticks and glue or tape them together in a triangle shape. While those are drying, cut a triangle out of a piece of paper; this will be placed within the popsicle stick design and be the body of the dinosaur. Cut out some other dinosaur features, too, like a long neck, short feet, and pointy spikes. Color or paint the popsicle sticks, then glue the paper pieces in place.
