



## Today's books:
















#### Opening (Closing) Song: Hands Go Up

#### This week's early literacy practice: PLAY!

When children act out stories they know, either as a play or with props or puppets, they practice sequencing events. They also are exploring and investigating story structure. Oral language is the critical component that helps build narrative skills. This includes talking about their play, describing what they are doing, negotiating roles, and discussing props. ### Continue the Fun...

#### Play with Puppets (via clel.org)

Play is how children learn about their world. Studies have shown that children really benefit from time to play on their own and the ability to use their imaginations. Use simple props such as a puppet or a stuffed animal to tell a story. Use silly voices for different characters and ask your child to join in.
