Print Motivation (interest in and enjoyment of books and reading)

Helping your children associate books and reading with something enjoyable and positive means being flexible: read the books your child is most excited about - even if it's the same one over and over - and don't get frustrated if your child loses interest before you've finished. Researchers have noted that children who have enjoyable experiences around books are more likely to stick with learning to read even if it difficult.

Continue the Fun...

Feed the Alphabet Monster (c/o icanteachmychild.com) Here's what you'll need: a plastic baby wipes container, bottle caps, and 1" stickers. Decorate your container monster with eyes, spikes...whatever your child can imagine! Then write letters (either capital or lowercase) on the stickers and place them on the bottle caps. Have your child "feed" the caps to the monster one at a time while saying each letter.
