














Opening (Closing) Song: Hands Go Up

Learning Continues at Home!

Narrative Skills (telling stories, describing people, places, and events)

The ability to predict and to remember a sequence of events both help children on the road to becoming good readers. After reading a story, help your child practice by answering questions like these together: "What happened first?", "How did the story end?", and "What do you remember about the story?"
