


Print Motivation (empowering children to love books!)

If your child doesn't feel like reading, don't force it; try another time when he or she is ready to listen. Never feel bad about stopping, even if you haven't finished the book. The more pleasant each reading experience is, the more your child will want to spend time with books! On the other hand, if your child is enjoying one book and asks for it again and again, keep reading it! (For as long as your sanity can stand, of course.) The repetition helps them build all sorts of important skills.






