


Making Alphabet Soup!

- 1. Fill a large bowl with any type of waterproof alphabet letters (foam, plastic, etc.).
- 2. Give each child a bowl and allow them to pick letters out of the large bowl with big tongs.
- 3. Have them put the letters in their bowl and then allow them to pour water over the letters to make "soup."
- 4. Encourage the kids to talk about which letters they are "eating."
- * Many kids will want to make "soup" over and over again. This activity could also be done in the bathtub or outside to minimize flooding!
