














Opening (Closing) Song: Happy Day

Phonological Awareness (hearing the smaller sounds within words)

Did you know that singing is one way to help children learn the sounds in language which will eventually help them learn to sound out words?

Songs have a distinct note for each syllable so children hear the rhythm of language and hear words broken down into parts.

Float or Sink?

- 1. Fill the water table or bucket with water.
- 2. Explain the safety rules that go along with water play. Remind your child that the water stays in the bucket or water table.
- 3. Pick some objects to go in the water (stay away from wooden toys and things with batteries).
- 4. Ask them, "Which items float, and which sink?"
- 5. Encourage them to experiment by putting different objects into the water. Observe and discuss the outcome. Ask your child which objects are heavier, which are lighter.
- 6. Help your child use problem-solving techniques to guess which is heavier.
