

Vocabulary (Knowing the names of things and understanding feelings & concepts)

Why is it important for children to hear a wide range of vocabulary and to expose them to many words?

Children need to know the meaning of words to understand what they are reading. When you think about it, you know if you are reading a word correctly if you have heard it before. You are sounding it out. The more words children hear, the more ready they will be to make connections between sounding out words and knowing they're pronouncing them correctly.

Continue the Fun... Milk Painting

You'll need: Almond or Cow's milk, dishsoap, Q-tips, food coloring, shallow plates or wide bowls

- 1. Fill a plate or bowl with milk
- 2. Drop in at least 2 drops of 4 colors of food coloring.
- 3. Generously dip the end of a Q-tip in dishsoap, now dip the Q-tip into the milk next to a drop of color.
- 4. Gently swirl the Q-tip through different colors and you'll see rivers of color starting to form!
