












Songs

Itsy Bitsy Spider




The itsy bitsy spider went up the water spout.

Vocabulary (knowing the meaning of lots of words!)

Vocabulary is one of the early literacy skills that researchers say is important for children to have in order to learn to read. The more vocabulary children have the easier it will be for them to understand what they are reading. Vocabulary is knowing the names of things, feelings, concepts, and ideas.

Sing Along with Me!

Even though your child cannot speak, it is important to talk with her. Children who are spoken to a lot during their early years end up knowing many more words than those who are not spoken to very much. (Sing to the tune of "Do Your Ears Hang Low") (Match actions to the words) I have ten little fingers And they all belong to me. I can make them do things, Would you like to see? I can shut them up tight, Or open them all wide, I can put them all together, Or make them all hide. I can make them jump high, I can make them fall down low. I can make them clap loudly, Or clap them soft and slow.


