












Songs

Wake up and wiggle in the morning!



Letter Knowledge (knowing that letters are different from each other, have names, and represent sounds)


The main idea behind Letter Knowledge is shape recognition, so now is a great time to start pointing out basic shapes to your child. Give them shapes of different sizes and textures to feel and experiment with, and remember to repeat each shape's name a few times.

Continue the Fun...

Letter Hunt

You'll need: Letters (magnetic letters work great), corn meal, small container like a sweater storage box, and an "answer key" with the same alphabet letters written on it.

Put the corn meal in your container and then "hide" all of the letters in the corn meal. Have your child use their hands to dig out the letters and then ask them to match them to the letters on the answer key.
