The Silly Hat Song

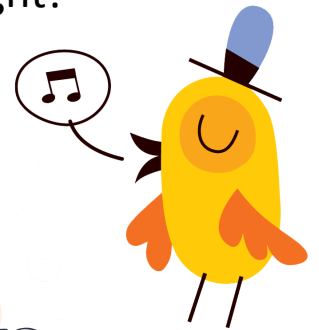
(tune: "This Old Man")

Materials: tissue box, construction paper, labels

Cover each cube with a different color of construction paper. The first cube will be songs to sing together. Apps for Laps!

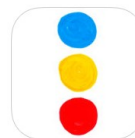
Spending screen time together - talking and thinking about what you see and do - adds the most value and meaning for your child. Try one of these apps with your child at Schlow!
