












Songs

Early Literacy Skill: Vocabulary (knowing the meanings of words for things, concepts, feelings & ideas)


Helping your child learn the names of colors is just one way to expand their vocabulary. By describing what you do throughout the day in new and unusual ways, you can easily introduce your child to a ton of new words. For example, instead of talking about going for a *walk*, you can go for a *stroll*, and then practice walking in fun ways: sauntering, marching, or even waddling.

No-Mess Color Mixing

Pour red and blue paint into a plastic bag, seal it, and ask your child to use their fingers to mix the two colors together. Talk about the colors that you started with, as well as the color they've created. Try it with as many combinations as you can, remembering to talk about what you're doing all the while!


