














Opening (Closing) Song: Happy Day

Learning Continues at Home

Early Literacy Skill: Letter Knowledge (knowing that letters are different from each other, have names, and represent sounds)

The main idea behind Letter Knowledge is shape recognition, so now is a great time to start pointing out basic shapes to your child. Give them shapes of different sizes and textures to feel and experiment with, and remember to repeat each shape's name a few times.

Carve a pumpkin with your child, and make sure to save the seeds. Use them to form shapes, letters, numbers, or anything they can think of! You can also spread them out on a clean baking sheet and drive trucks and cars through them.
