












### Songs

You put your baby up...




#### **Open, Shut Them**

## Learning Continues at Home

Early Literacy Skill: Background Knowledge (prior knowledge, things the child has learned; has four categories: general knowledge, conceptual thinking, content knowledge, and book/story knowledge)

A great way to help your child build background knowledge is to let him or her "hear you thinking". The more you talk out loud throughout the day - describing the things you are doing together or the things that you see - the more familiar your child will become with the world.






