












Songs

Little White Duck



Cuckoo (lift baby into the air)




I Saw a Little Bird

Learning Continues at Home



Vocabulary (knowing the names of things and understanding feelings and concepts)

Because it is easier for children to read words that they know, it is important that they learn many, many words. Call things what they are. If you know the name of a flower, call it by its name – rose, daffodil, or pansy. Remember not to "dumb things down," while keeping things on a level the child can handle.
