












Songs

Letter Knowledge (knowing that letters are different from each other, have names, and represent sounds)

The main idea behind Letter Knowledge is shape recognition, so now is a great time to start pointing out basic shapes to your child. Give them shapes of different sizes and textures to feel and experiment with, and remember to repeat each shape's name a few times.

Construction Play Mat

Using a piece of construction paper or cardstock as your base, create a construction play mat! Help your kiddo cut out various shapes - rocks, trees, bodies of water, buildings, whatever you can think of! - and glue them onto the mat. Make sure to draw or cut out a road, too. You can even add real pebbles or sand if you have them! After everything dries, your little construction worker can drive his cars and trucks all over the play mat.
