














Opening song - Hands Go Up

Early Literacy Skill: Print Motivation

Positive experiences with books are so important for your child, but there are no hard and fast rules to follow! Any amount of time, any book about any topic - it all encourages a love of reading in your child.



Making Alphabet Soup!

- 1. Fill a large bowl with any type of waterproof alphabet letters (foam, plastic, etc.).
- 2. Give each child a bowl and allow them to pick letters out of the large bowl with big tongs.

3. Have them put the letters in their bowl and then allow them to pour water over the letters to make "soup."

4. Encourage the kids to talk about which letters they are "eating."

* Many kids will want to make "soup" over and over again. This activity could also be done in the bathtub or outside to minimize flooding!
