












Songs

Learning Continues at Home

Early Literacy Skill: Vocabulary (knowing the meanings of words for things, concepts, feelings & ideas)

Researchers have found that children with large vocabularies, who know lots of different words, find it easier to read when that time comes. As you sing, talk, read, write and play with your children throughout the day, you can build your children's vocabulary.



Narrate your day!

One way you can increase your child's vocabulary is by "narrating your day." That simply means to **talk** about what you are doing while you are doing it. Or you can say what your children are doing while they are doing it. You might even add little stories about when you were a child. By doing this, you are exposing your children to lots of language! Leave your children time to respond, even if you cannot understand what he or she is saying.


